We sampled actual survey findings

We closely read 71 findings from 49 Ohio surveys: 40 infection-control findings and 31 pressure-injury findings.

THE FIRST SIGNAL

Infection control reached the most homes. Pressure injury care had the most G-or-higher findings.

The counts show where to look. The findings show where daily work may break down.

Three signals from the close read

These examples show how the full report moves from counts to daily work.

1 Breakdowns happened between care steps

Hand cleaning and glove-use problems often appeared when staff moved between residents, tasks, or clean and dirty steps.

2 An order did not always lead to completed care

The gap could appear anywhere from the order and supplies to the treatment, follow-up, and record.

3 Records did not always match real care

Missing information and inaccurate information are different problems. Both can hide where the care process broke down.
